





- NO make-up / studs only for jewellery






The School Day


- Our school week is organised so that all children have access to 32.5 hours of learning time over the week

The School Day


- Attendance is monitored closely.

- If your child is going to be absent for any reason you must inform the school office: Tel 01482 223753







Reading at home

- We ask that children read at least 5 times a week to practice their fluency.




Read slowly and needed to sound out lots of words ie monster, blue, garden.










How can you help



The curriculum

Science

We will plan enquiries to answer questions about animals and humans, reporting and presenting our findings and create conclusions.

Geography


We will explore rivers around the world and look more closely to home at the features of the River Hull; understanding its journey.

PE

We will develop our attacking and defending skills in football, learning how to control the ball, find a space and how to make accurate passes.

History

We will travel back in time, looking at key changes between the Stone Age and Iron Age and the impact on the people living in those eras.



Design Technology

We will be researching, designing and making a cheesecake which combines naturally sourced, sustainable and seasonal products.

Art

We will study the great artist Pablo Picasso and his famous work Woman with Guitar' to create a drawing of a musical instrument showing tone.

Computing

We will interpret a range of data and use J2e to navigate a database effectively, answering questions and presenting information as a graph.

RE


We will discuss why people celebrate religious and cultural events, the actions and rituals taking place and the importance of remembering.

Music

We will listen and appraise different musical styles, develop our musical notation skills and work on improvising music to help tell a story.
