The School Day

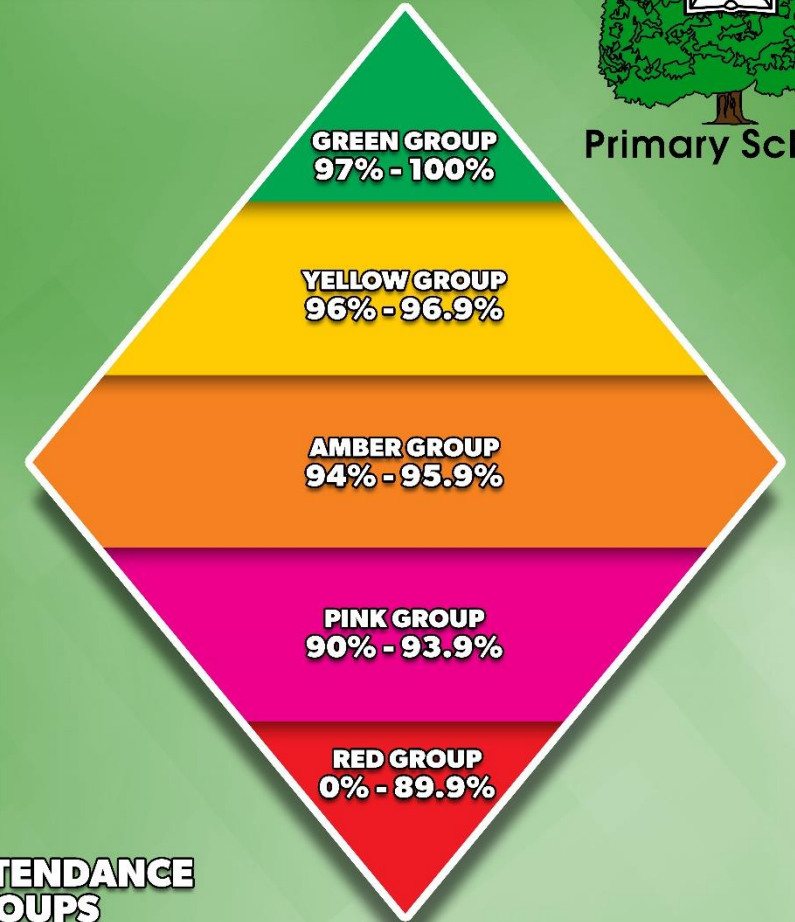
- Our school week is organised so that all children have access to 32.5 hours of learning time over the week

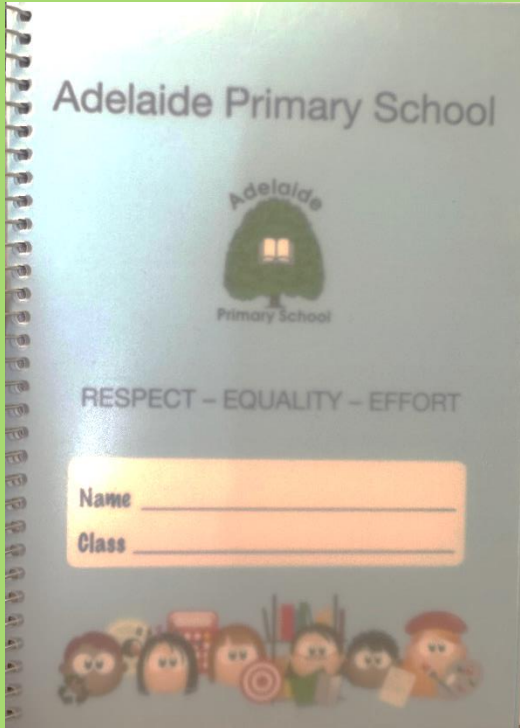



Reading at home

- **Supporting your child to be a fluent reader is one of the most important things you can do.**
- Children will be given a reading book on **Monday (Tigers)** or **Tuesday (Lions)** to read at home each night.
- We ask that children read at least 5 times a week to practice their fluency.
- Please sign your child's reading record book each time they read at home.
- Reading record books will be checked at school each day and children will be rewarded.










How can you help

Please note that these tests are statutory – do not book holidays for these dates.

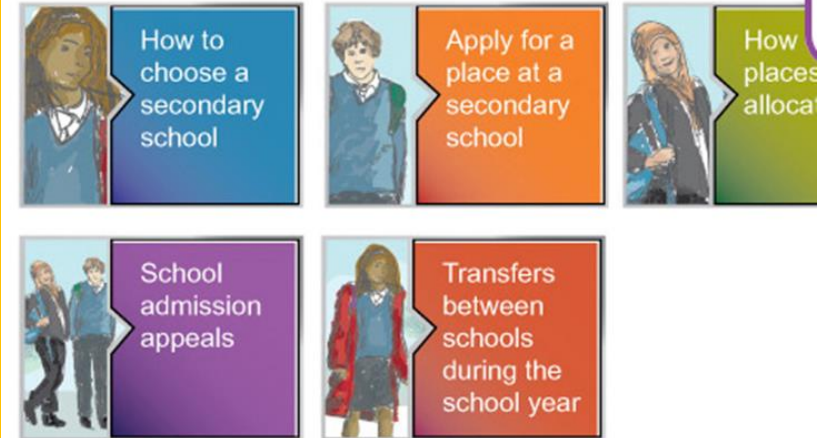
We will hold a SATs meeting in Feb or March for further information.
